Minutes of the 2022 Annual Business Meeting

Secretary Rosalyn Klasinski asked the delegates present to read over the minutes and if there were any questions or changes needed, please comment.

Sharon Hernandez, #10122 – On page 2 of the Minutes asked about the \$1500 donation to the State Auxiliary from #7502.

Jan Cogar, #7502 asked if the \$1500 was put into the CSLA Savings Account since no Scholarships were awarded in 2022 and so far none in 2023. State President Mary Staples confirmed that the \$1500 was in the CSLA Savings Account

To keep the Meeting moving on, Mary will further changes to Rosalyn. Motion was made for the Minutes to be approved with suggested changes by Margo Fish, #13559 and seconded by Pam Jenkins, #12336.

Treasurer Report

Treasurer Lorena Villegas asked the Delegates to look at the Fiscal Summaries provided in their Convention packets.

As of March 31, 2023 the balances in the account were as follows:

Checking: \$448.21 Savings: \$8,632.74 CD: \$3,825.93

Lorena reported that \$5,756.12 was moved from Checking to Savings in September 2023 in order to earn more interest.

Lorena reported that there was an account change in February 2023 due to the Checking Account being compromised with unauthorized Verizon charges. The Bank did credit back the unauthorized charges.

Pam Jenkins, #12336 asked if the \$1500 donation from #7502 for the Scholarship was included in the September 2023 transfer of Checking to Savings. Lorena confirmed that yes, it was.

Sue Mason, #13559 asked why the Scholarship monies were not a line item.

State President Mary Staples stated this was the Financial Report and Scholarship is in the Budget we will go over.

Sharon Hernandez, #10122 stated that the Savings Account was designated for Scholarship.

Pam Jenkins, #12336 asked what Audit needs to happen?

Madeline McGuire, #11730 stated she was confused that the \$1500 was not showing as a deposit in the Treasurer's Report.

Dianne Heimann, #7502 stated \$1500 was given in 2022 (no exact date) but happened before Convention of 2022.

The Treasurer's Report presented today included the 2021-2022 Fiscal Summary from August 2021 through July 2022 and the 2022-2023 Fiscal Summary from August 2022 through July 2023 (as of March 31, 2023)

A motion was made by Sharon Hernandez, #10122 to approve the Treasurer's Report with corrected change and seconded by Wendy Logue, #8909. All Delegates approved.
